COVID-19 lockdown learning **ALERT LEVEL 3 AT TAI**Thursday 20 August 2020



Dear Parents/whanau of Te Atatu Intermediate.

Kia ora koutou to you all. This week we have once again begun our distance learning with students. Hopefully all students have now had the chance to connect in with their teacher and have tasks that have been set on Google classroom or Hapara. We have delivered some school made hard copy packs as well for those with connectivity issues.

ONLINE LEARNING

Our <u>specialisation teachers</u> (Art, Science, PE, Music and Performing Arts) have all set tasks - there are codes that they have for their curriculum areas, which class teachers have shared. Technology has also got activities to work on, in fact Mrs Brailsford and Mrs Perry, our Food Tech teachers have combined to coordinate another competition - My Breakfast Rules! A cooked breakfast competition. The other <u>technology teachers</u> all have tasks set under their codes as well. Again, class teachers will know these codes if students require them.

As last time, we suggest that learning doesn't become a battle between your selves and your child. Some students will prefer the co-ordinated set times for their work, others may prefer the grazing method of dipping in and out of different activities or even times. A good idea could be that students follow their normal school timetable during the day. Teachers have set their Google Meet/Zoom times for the morning and Spec/Tech have organised theirs for afternoons to avoid clashes.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION SUPPORT

The Ministry of Education has again set up Home Learning TV. Papa Kāinga TV is back on air with new lessons to support learning for students at home or at school. All of the previous content, including lessons for 12-15 year olds, is available to watch anytime on TVNZ OnDemand.

They have also provided support for helping children and young people cope with the changes caused by COVID-19. This means providing accurate information, discussing facts without causing undue alarm, and re-establishing routines. More guidance for parents, caregivers and whānau is available here and online at Te Rito Toi.

There is advice for parents on looking after their wellbeing, and the wellbeing of others, on the learning from home website. There are also <u>three COVID-19 Wellbeing Guides</u> available providing further advice to parents and teachers.

To our Auckland whānau

With the change in COVID-19 alert levels to Level 3 across the Auckland region, the wellbeing of our community is paramount.

Practicing guidelines set jointly by the Ministry of Health and Dental Council of New Zealand state that all routine dental treatment should be postponed. Therefore, the Children's Community Dental Service (Auckland Regional Dental Service) is only able to provide urgent and emergency dental care to children, once the child's condition has been assessed by a dental clinician over the phone.

The Dental Council of New Zealand has further advised that if a child's dental condition can be accurately diagnosed and effectively managed *without* needing to see the child in-person, then that is best. This means the child's dental condition may be able to be managed with medication alone.

From 12 August 2020, we will have seven essential dental care clinics open across Auckland (please find the list below). Opening hours are Monday-Friday, 8am-4.30pm.
