SCHOOL UNIFORM

We ask the following in regards to uniform:

- The uniform is worn with pride.
- The whole correct uniform be worn at all times whether it is the sport's or dress uniform.
- When there is a problem with the uniform, please send a note of explanation with your child from the parents or caregivers and the correct uniform is worn again as soon as possible.
- Please do not make substitutes with the uniform.
- Te Atatū Menswear has the official uniform.
- Skirts, trousers or shorts are not to be worn on the hips and <u>shorts must not be unduly large.</u>
- Jewellery is restricted to a watch and plain gold or silver stud earrings for boys and girls.
- All <u>hair</u> longer than collar length must be neatly tied up. Please do not wear trendy hairstyles requiring large amounts of hair product to keep them up and please keep hair dye to the long summer holiday breaks. No boy's "rat's tails" or shaved hair patterns please.
- No tattoos please.
- Please keep nail polish, false nails (for safety reasons) and all makeup to the holidays.

*Please note Te Atatū Intermediate School handbooks will not be available in future

Please note, camp trips, and other school cultural events, also maths resources e.g. scoot pad, while not a compulsory part of the curriculum will enhance your child's learning.

They are optional.

Shipping cost is free – if orders are over \$45.00

Therefore, as a school, <u>we do not ask for a school donation</u>. Below is some information for all parents/caregivers/whānau around the donations scheme:

- We cannot charge you for anything involved in the core learning programme (curriculum), including "subject fees."
- We can ask you to pay for goods provided that are optional (for example instruments, sports academy)
- You need to provide your child with a uniform but you can choose to buy it from the school/kura or, if available, to buy a new or second hand uniform elsewhere.
- You should not be pressured to buy goods or services from a school/kura but if you agree to buy a good or service, you must pay for it.
- If your child is involved in after school/weekend sports teams or after hours cultural activities (extra-curricular activities), these are optional. If you choose for your child to participate, you may be asked to cover the costs of these activities.
- We can ask for payment towards overnight camps (AIMS tournament, school bi-annual camp which will be Lakewood Lodge or Motutapu)
- You can make a voluntary donation to your school or kura at any time and if you choose to do this, GST is not payable on the donation and you can claim a tax credit.

CORE SCHOOL LEARNING THE SCHOOL WILL PAY

*MathsBuddy - The school pays the \$26 per student fee for this. Maths Buddy is a part of our mathematics programme. It is New Zealand's leading online interactive maths programme that complements what students learn in class, supporting them to achieve top results. Students may work at their own pace, allowing them to pause and rewind the lesson, practice questions online and receive immediate feedback. Teachers and parents receive regular reports to monitor student's progress.

*Class trips - Class trips that relate to core learning within the curriculum will be covered through the donations scheme. Parents will still need to give permission for their child to attend

*Curriculum events - Any events such as Life Education, shows promoting learning that come to the school etc will be covered within the donations scheme. Again, parents will still need to give permission for these events.

*Technology - as technology is part of curriculum, there will be no costs associated to parents from these activities.

Opt in activities such as camp, AIMS, sports teams do incur a cost. There are two ways in which these can be paid;
