<u>Board of Trustees -</u> We are very fortunate to have a committed and stable Board. Our Board members again opted into the Ministry of Education's scheme whereby the MoE allocates funding to schools for curriculum related expenses. Therefore we do not ask parents for a parent donation or school or Technology fees. Activities such as music, netball or after school teams that are selected by students will incur a cost.

Our Board members consist of **Mike Hirst (Chair), Nathan Hooker (Treasurer), Chris Larking, Hayley McNickle, Amy Fraser and Darren White.** Our staff representative is **Tere Tamarua**, who is also an Across Schools Liaison in our Te Atatu Community of Learning/Kahui Ako.

Red Light Covid system - Under the current red light system, our priority is for the safety of all on site - students and staff. We have a number of plans in place to ensure that this occurs. We are also making sure that student learning is continuing, with routines and procedures to create a normal as possible timetable. As part of this process, the main change for us is that we are currently operating as 4 Mini-schools (Rooms 1-4 / Rooms 5-8 / Rooms 9-11/16 / Rooms 13-15)- each with designated teachers attached and designated playground areas that rotate each day. Our aim is to make sure that should Covid transmissions occur at TAI, we can mostly continue with only disruptions to the affected class or Mini school.

<u>Music</u> - Next <u>Thursday 17th February</u>, there will be a Music Information Meeting which will be <u>held</u> <u>online via Google Meet</u> for parents interested in their child learning an instrument this year. More information will come out next week - look for the 2022 Music Welcome letter next week which will have more information.

<u>Property update -</u> Over the last few months, we have had a number of projects completed within the school. Our new Turf courts outside Room 9 have been completed allowing more capacity for basketball and volleyball. A number of buildings were painted over the holidays and at the end of last year, the covered areas outside of Rooms 6-8 and Science and Art were painted and re-covered. Significant drainage was also carried out, including to our playground. Due to Covid delays, the playground/ fitness equipment will be getting new bark next Wednesday so students will be able to use this from next Thursday. The middle of the year will see extensive renovations to our administration/ sick bays and staffroom areas as well as a full refurbishment of the Science and Art Rooms.

Tuck shop - Unfortunately, as a result of the lockdown last year, our tuck shop providers were unable to continue. Currently we do not have a tuck shop. We are using this time to investigate other options for students to order lunch. We will keep you posted and hope to have something in place soon. In the meantime, students will need to bring their lunch with them, or buy their lunch at the shops on the way to school. Please can **all** students bring a water bottle to school filled with water during the red light setting.

<u>Uniform -</u> It has been great to see the students in their uniforms. Please could all items of uniform be named, with a room number so we can get lost items back to the owner. Waitakere Improving School Attendance Programme is continuing our "Return to the Workforce" programmes for parents who currently receive the Sole Parent Support benefit.

We are able to employ 12 Learning Support (Teacher Aides) to work in one of the following schools: Henderson Intermediate; Konini Primary; Liston College; Rangeview Intermediate; Te Atatu Intermediate; and Waitakere SDA School.

The positions are for a **26 week fixed term period** (excluding school holidays) commencing **Monday 14**th **March 2022.** The projects are partially funded by Work and Income through the Ministry of Development Flexi-Wage Project in the Community. The rate of pay will be \$21.84 per hour (A Grade, Step 1 Teacher Aide Collective Agreement).

26 WEEKS FIXED TERM EMPLOYMENT

20 HOURS PER WEEK

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We are able to employ 12 Learning Support (Teacher Aides) to work in one of the following schools: Henderson Intermediate; Konini Primary; Liston College; Rangeview Intermediate; Te Atatu Intermediate; and Waitakere SDA School.

We are also able to employ 2 Enviroschools Learning Support Aides, one at Flanshaw Road Primary, and one at Konini Primary.

The 20 hours of work for both programmes is during normal school hours.

The positions are for a **26 week fixed term period** (excluding school holidays) commencing **Monday 14**th **March 2022.** The projects are partially funded by Work and Income through the Ministry of Development Flexi-Wage Project in the Community. The rate of pay will be \$21.84 per hour (A Grade, Step 1 Teacher Aide Collective Agreement). There is no guarantee that the Learning Support positions or the Enviroschools Learning Support Aide positions will continue after the end of the project.

Successful <u>Learning Support</u> applicants will develop learning support/ teacher aide skills through working with teachers and students in a classroom, supporting literacy, numeracy and general learning needs; and preparing teaching resources and other duties as requested by the school. A job description and training will be provided by each school.

Successful <u>Enviroschools Learning Support Aides</u> will receive training in the Enviroschools kaupapa and related content, including waste, horticulture, gardening and preparing food skills, pests, biodiversity, energy and water conservation through a network of resources as well as from Enviroschools and Auckland Council Sustainable Schools. General Learning Support/Teacher Aide skills will also be developed as an essential part of the role.

PLEASE NOTE: It is <u>mandatory</u> to be double vaccinated against Covid-19 to work in schools and successful applicants will be required to provide proof of vaccinations. Successful applicants must also complete a satisfactory police vet and to be available for interviews during the week Monday 21st – Friday 25th February.
