## **Education Outside the Classroom - Term 4, 2020**

This November, we are having our camps and Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC) experiences. Students will need to opt in to ONE of the events listed below.

Our school-based EOTC programme involves a variety of activities and day trips, which are all paid for by the school. There is a camp going to Lakewood Lodge and a camp going to Motutapu Island. ## Option 2 - Lakewood Lodge 2020 (\$400)
