## BEACH AND SURF EDUCATION

Earlier this week an <u>info</u>
<u>newsletter</u> was emailed out
about our Beach Education
programme, which is part of our
Health and Physical Education
curriculum during week 8 this
term (March 20-24).

NZ Surf Academy is providing our students with a full day of surf safety, surf lessons, beach games and activities. These programmes enable students to develop more confidence and knowledge in the surf and provide important skills to stay safe in New Zealand's waters. Surfing will be done in waist high water, and students will be in a wetsuit which acts as a buoyancy aid and have a surfboard strapped to their ankle. The aim is to build the students' confidence within a safe environment.

The day includes:

- A group surfing lesson with qualified & enthusiastic surf instructors
- Beach safety & surf lifesaving
- Board handling, paddling & stance demonstration
- Beach games and other activities

#### TERM TWO - TEACHER ONLY DAY

#### **MONDAY 24 APRIL**

The Ministry of Education has given schools two teacher only days during 2023 in order to support implementation of the New Zealand Curriculum refresh. From the Ministry site; 'The first teacher-only day in 2023 can be held during the first two-weeks of Term Two 2023 between Monday 24 April and Friday 5 May 2023. Timing of the second in 2023 and in 2024 will be confirmed with sector representatives in the new year. Primary and secondary schools Boards are encouraged to coordinate the timing of these teacher-only days.'

As a Kāhui Ako / Community of Learning - all Te Atatū cluster schools will hold the designated teacher only day on Monday 24 April - this is the Monday straight after the holidays and Tuesday is then ANZAC Day - school would re-start for term 2 on WEDNESDAY 26 APRIL. This date is also listed on our website.

#### YR 8 NETBALL TRIALS

Netball Trials for the year 8 netball teams begin Wednesday 15 March. All girls interested in trialling for year 8 teams are to be present Wednesday 15 straight after school. Netball trials should be finished by 4.30. Year 7 netball trials will be Wednesday 22nd March.

#### CITIZEN SCIENCE GROUP

Briar from Whitebait Connection and Bronwyn from Wild About Te Atatū have teamed up to teach our class about the effects of the changes that us humans have developed over time, some which have hurt the environment. The first session was in the classroom experimenting on how water travelled through different types of environments and an activity called who dirtied the water. We are looking forward to going to Orangihina and doing the real mahi to be the kaitiaki of our local environment through some citizen science monitoring activities and then taking action.



#### YEAR 7 & 8 SCHOOL-BASED IMMUNISATION PROGRAMME 2023

YEAR 7 STUDENTS WILL BE OFFERED THE BOOSTRIX VACCINE (TDAP) IN SCHOOL. THIS VACCINE IS A BOOSTER OF TETANUS, DIPHTHERIA, AND WHOOPING COUGH (PERTUSSIS).

MOST CHILDREN RECEIVED THESE IMMUNISATIONS AS PRE-SCHOOLERS.

THIS IS SCHEDULED FOR 18/05/2023 WITH A CATCHUP DATE 1-2 WEEKS LATER FOR STUDENTS ABSENT ON THE DAY (25/05/2023).

YEAR 8 STUDENTS WILL BE OFFERED THE HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS (HPV) VACCINE IN SCHOOL. THIS IS A NEW ZEALAND-SCHEDULED VACCINE THAT IS RECOMMENDED TO BE GIVEN AT 12 YEARS OF AGE.

STUDENTS NEED TWO DOSES WITH A 6-MONTH GAP BETWEEN DOSES 1 AND 2.

DOSE 1 IS SCHEDULED FOR 18/05/2023 WITH A CATCHUP DATE 1-2 WEEKS LATER FOR STUDENTS ABSENT ON THE DAY (25/05/2023).

#### MINISTRY OF HEALTH

Are you and your whānau protected from measles?

With people travelling overseas again, there's a risk that someone with measles could unknowingly bring the disease back to Aotearoa.

Measles spreads easily and quickly, usually between people who are unimmunised or only partially immunised. It can be serious and life threatening. In the 2019 measles outbreak in Aotearoa, more than 30% of the people infected had to be admitted to hospital.

The best protection against measles is the free MMR vaccine. It will protect you and your whānau, and prevent the virus from spreading.

You will be protected against measles if you:

• had 2 doses of the MMR vaccine

• had measles before

• were born before 1 Jan 1969.

If you're unsure if you or your tamariki have had any or both doses of the MMR vaccine, check by calling your GP or Hauora provider. Alternatively, check your Plunket Well Child Tamariki Ora book. If you're still not sure, be safe and get immunised – there are no safety concerns with having an extra dose. MMR vaccines are free at your local health provider and many pharmacies.

As measles still occurs in many countries and if you're travelling overseas these holidays, it's especially important to be immunised to prevent the risk of being unknowingly infected and causing an outbreak in Aotearoa upon your return.


New users can set up a myKindo account easily! <u>Click here</u> to register & create an account. All you need is the email address the school has on file for you.
