#### **GIRLS' SELF DEFENCE**

In week 6 (November 14 - 17) our Year 8 girls have the opportunity to take part in a Girls' Self Defence Project course run by Kia Haumaru -Personal Safety Education. The course is open to all girls and gender diverse students in Year 8. The facilitator is a qualified and experienced Personal Safety Educator and has run several successful courses at TAI in previous years. She will help the students to learn ways of dealing with unsafe people, situations, and threats to their safety- such as dealing with stranger attacks, being followed, and issues relating to cyber safety. The course will emphasise how students can 'think' their way out of a threatening situation and how important it is to tell a safe adult if something happens. In their quarterfinals, against Thailand, the game was delayed at half-time due to the lightning and thunder being too close. It was then postponed to the next day, which they won, 53-20. A tough semi-final, losing against Japan who are the 6th top team in the world. We placed 3rd overall beating Malaysia 20-7 in front of their home crowd.

### **MARKET DAY**

This term, our overriding theme is Future Possibilities. We are exploring aspects of entrepreneurship, careers, and financial literacy. These themes are woven across the curriculum. A big drive for this unit are our market days. Each syndicate will host a market day over the course of three weeks. The first market is next week, Friday 17th November, and is being hosted by Kākāpō syndicate. Kea syndicate follow on Friday 24th November, and Tūī close us out with their market on Friday 1st December. Each market runs from 12:00pm-1:00pm.

Students across the school are working hard, designing, and creating products or services. They are learning how to use spreadsheets to record their budgets, expenditure, and income. Many are working out start-up costs, with all members contributing to a fund from which their items or ingredients will be purchased. Others are tracking individual spending through the collection of receipts. They are all hoping to turn a profit so that their expenses

They are all hoping to turn a profit so that their expenses can be covered before being rewarded with some sort of class activity - it all depends on how much each class makes. 10% of profits will be donated back to the school where they will be used to contribute to the funding of the new multi-purpose court being constructed behind the library.
