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YR8 GIRLS' SELF DEFENCE

Starting today our year 8 girls have the opportunity to take part in a Girls' Self Defence Project course run by Kia Haumaru - Personal Safety Education. The course is open to all girls and gender-diverse students in YR8. The facilitator is a qualified and experienced Personal Safety Educator, and has run several successful courses at TAI in previous years. She will help the students to learn ways of dealing with unsafe people, situations, and threats to their safety- such as dealing with stranger attacks, being followed, and issues relating to cyber safety. The course will emphasise how students can 'think' their way out of a threatening situation, and how important it is to tell a safe adult if something happens.
