We are extremely fortunate at Te Atatū Intermediate to have Orangihina (Harbour View) nature reserve right on our doorstep. We have organised for every class to visit Orangihina with their classroom teacher during Week 6,7 or Week 8 of this term to participate in the Wild About Te Atatū programme run by the Environmental Team at Community Waitakere. The purpose of the visit is to give all students an opportunity to learn more about our unique local environment and our roles as kaitiaki in helping to protect our big backyard.

The 1 hour 30 minute session will focus on:-

- What makes Orangihina Reserve and its estuary so special and unique?
- **Bird Watching** Use binoculars to observe & identify the different types of birds found at Orangihina and feeding on the mudflats.
- What are the threats to the birds and why?

- **Tracking Tunnels** View tracking tunnel cards and identify the foot prints of pests to discover what introduced predators are found at Orangihina.
- What actions can be taken to control introduced predators? How can we help?......
