

COVID-19 lockdown learning
ALERT LEVEL 3
Wednesday 22 April



Dear Parents/whanau of Te Atatu Intermediate.

As mentioned in yesterday's letter, the Government has announced that New Zealand will move into Alert Level 3 on Tuesday 28 April. Alert Level 3 will see some parents leave their 'bubble' and go back to their place of work. **Te Atatu Intermediate will be open for supervision of students who cannot learn from home from Wednesday 29th April.**

Students will be supervised by staff and will continue with their Distance Learning plans in small "bubbles" of initially up to ten students (this may increase over time). Students will need to ensure that they bring everything that they need for the day with them. The tuckshop will not be open. Students will need to bring a drink bottle, lunch, a book to read, and stationery. It would be a good idea for students to bring headphones if they have some.

The Government is asking all students that can remain at home do so and continue with Distance Learning. If your child has a health condition that means they are at a greater risk of a severe illness you must keep them at home. If your child is sick please also ensure you keep them at home.

In order to ensure the safety of students and staff who do come to school, we will be operating with strict enforcement of health and safety measures.

We will also communicate further once we have a better indication of numbers as to start/finish times (as these will potentially be staggered), what "bubble" your child will be in and so on.
