Re: NZEI Industrial Strike action Thursday 16 March
Te Atatū Intermediate is closed for instruction - open for <u>limited</u> supervision

As you may have heard on the news last night and from other media - NZEI (The teachers union) has advised us that teachers have voted to take industrial action on **Thursday 16 March as they have not been able to reach an agreement to settle their collective agreements.**

NZEI on behalf of our teachers have shared the following with our community;

Our tamariki need a quality education. And we want to give that to them. Unfortunately, the funding for our schools and kindergartens is not enough for us to give us the time we would like to support all our kids to thrive.

We need to attract and retain educators by ensuring that teaching is a valued and attractive profession.

Principals and teachers in primary and area schools and kindergartens have considered at

length offers from the government to settle our respective collective agreements.

The offers did not meet our expectations, nor make sufficient steps towards the changes we

need for our children to succeed. You may have seen that we voted to take industrial action on 16 March. It's the last thing we wanted to do. And the decision was not taken lightly. We felt that this was the only way the government would listen and recognise that when they support our children to learn and succeed, we are supporting whānau and communities to thrive. We look forward to another great year in 2023 – and together with your support, building the case for better investment in our tamariki. Our teachers work hard for our tamariki/children and want to be resourced sufficiently to meet the challenging needs of teaching in the 21st century.

As the majority of Te Atatū Intermediate staff are either NZEI or PPTA members who will be undertaking industrial action; **Te Atatū Intermediate school will be closed for instruction on Thursday 16 March.**

We will be able to provide supervision for a small number of children with the few non-union staff we have available. This supervision will only be available for families who have no other option on this day.
