COVID level 3 lockdown (Newsletter #12 –Term 4 – Week 3)

Week 3 of the final term is almost at a close and that will bring us nearly to a full term of being in lockdown. I am attending a meeting today for Auckland Primary/Intermediate Principals via Zoom, around the possible, or indicative return to school for years 1-8 students on the 15 November. At this stage, a decision will be made early next week around whether this date will go ahead or not. What Liam Rutherford, the NZEI President (Primary Teacher Union) stated in his weekly update to members, rings very true for us as a school. He stated;

"We all agree that the biggest concern is keeping staff, tamariki and whānau as safe as possible, and this needs to be the number one consideration for the Minister and Cabinet when they make their decision next Monday. We know all principals, teachers, support staff and parents will be keen to get some certainty so they can make plans."

Once we know more information around the decision, I will share with you the outcome and what the process would be for a <u>safe</u> return of students back to school should that be the decision.

In the meantime, we continue our priority for students to develop **<u>ROUTINE</u>** and to **<u>RECONNECT</u>** with each other online again next week to be ready to continue to develop, grow and nurture the learning journey in whatever form that has taken this lockdown period. Should we return to school, we will have this as our main focus as it is incredibly important to support all students to feel safe.
