I would like to thank you all for your generosity on our mufti day to support FWPS Akoteu of Sia'atoutai School and families in Tonga. We had to bring the date forward to make sure we made the container drop as it was leaving today for Tonga. We even received a thank you message from Charles Riechelmann (those of you of a certain vintage will remember him - an ex All Black!)! It was great to see the sea of red supporting an awesome cause for our friends in Tonga - so **Malo 'aupito** to you all.

#### **TAI Covid update**

Currently, we have positive cases within our school body who are isolating. To all affected whanau, we wish you a speedy recovery and look forward to your return to school. Under phase 3 of the red light setting, schools no longer conduct contact tracing. This means that when we identify that there is a positive case at school - we no longer notify contacts.

Health guidelines from the MOE for phase 3 state that household members of positive cases MUST isolate. Therefore, if anyone in your household tests positive for COVID, you all must isolate for 10 days. On the 11th day, provided students have no symptoms and are in good health, they can return to school.

#### It remains important that you notify us if your child tests positive for COVID-19


