A MESSAGE FROM MR EVANS - TUMUAKI / PRINCIPAL Tēnā koutou katoa o Te Atatū Intermediate whānau.

It's hard to believe that we are now half way through term 1. Over the disrupted term, our main focus has been to provide as normal a programme for the students as we possibly can, whilst keeping as safe as possible whilst the extremely contagious Omicron variant takes hold. This means that, for the most part, students have had their consistent classroom teacher that has been able to follow the core curriculum programme. There have been some changes to the specialist timetable - however, each mini school has had a designated specialist and technology teacher connected allowing for this. All classes have had their regular PE sessions.

TAI Covid update

Unfortunately, like around 90% of Auckland schools, we continue to have positive cases reported within our school body who are isolating. Again, I wish all affected students and their whānau, a very speedy recovery and we look forward to your child's return to school once they are well. A reminder that under phase 3 of the red light setting, schools no longer conduct contact tracing.

<u>Latest MoE requirements for schools is that we now only need to let them know daily numbers of positive cases</u>. We no longer require the names and test information as mentioned in previous newsletters.

I would like to thank parents for sending through previously, all the required information that we then inputed as per MoE requirements. Here's hoping we are reaching the peak and coming out the other side! Some classes have been impacted by teachers isolating. Where teachers have been sick, we have managed to cover classes whilst continuing the class programme - however, teachers that are isolating and not sick have been able to Google Meet with their class and teach online, with a supervisory staff member in the class. Another new experience for many. The aim - to keep things as normal as possible!

Health guidelines from the MOE for **phase 3** state that household members of positive cases **MUST** isolate. Therefore, if anyone in your household tests positive for COVID, new regulations require you all **must isolate for 7 days**. (**Day 0** is the day of the positive test- if asymptomatic, or the onset of symptoms. Household contacts now test day 3 and 7) **On the 8th day**, provided students who have tested positive have no symptoms and are in good health, or have returned negative tests if a household contact, they can return to school.

(This reduction in days comes into effect from Friday 11 March at 11.59pm)

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Please monitor your child's health and keep them home from school if they are unwell.

Teachers have set tasks and work on Google Classroom should your child need to isolate. We also have hard copy packs that we can deliver to local addresses - contact Deputy Principal Kelly Clarke on kelly.c@teatatu.school.nz

How to report your RAT result



There are two ways to report your rapid antigen test (RAT) result:



You can do it online at MyCovidRecord.nz

- set up a My Health Account if you don't already have one and you're over 12 - you will need your own email address and a valid form of ID
- if you already have a My Health Account, log in
- scroll to "Self-report a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) result,"
 click "Report test result" and follow the instructions



You can do it over the phone by calling 0800 222 478

- select option 3
- call any time between 8am and 8pm, 7 days a week
- use this to report RAT results for those under 12


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for their time and although they were nervous, they all want to do the best for the school. Congratulations to them all. Below is a message from the newly appointed team!
