Year 7 Boostrix Immunisations

All year 7s have received the Boostrix immunisation forms (11 year old immunisations) this week. Could you please fill in the consent or non consent part of the form and <u>return it to school by Friday 28 May</u>. The following information is from the Waitemata District Health Board; <u>Year 7 School Based Immunisation Programme 2021</u>

It is important to ensure our children remain protected from vaccine- preventable diseases.

Year 7 learners will be offered Boostrix vaccine (dTap) in school. This vaccine is a booster of diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough most children received last as preschoolers. 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Origins of Pink Shirt Day

Pink Shirt Day began in Canada in 2007 when two students took a stand against homophobic bullying after a new Year 10 student was harassed and threatened for wearing pink. These students bought dozens of pink shirts and distributed them to their classmates to wear the next day. The word got out online and hundreds of students showed up in pink, some from head-to-toe, to stand together against bullying. It has been celebrated in New Zealand since 2009.

At Te Atatu Intermediate, we strive to create an inclusive environment through our four WAKA values of whanaungatanga - creating the community of support, atawhai, caring, consideration and kindness towards one another, kaitiakitanga being responsible for ourselves and others, looking after our environment and ako, respectful relationships with each other - staff and students.
