The purpose of this water tank is to experiment within our STEM Science Inquiry on which water is sustainable in planting and growing our seeds into healthy edible fruit & vegetables.


Our STEM Science Inquiry is an initiative to engage our Pacific Island and Maori students into pursuing further tertiary education in the science fields.
