Coronavirus

<u>Lockdown drill</u>

This is the 3rd year that we have used the services of Harrison Tew, who specialise in emergency management plans for schools and workplaces. They will be in our school to practice our Lockdown Drill on Monday 10 February. They talk to the staff and students about the process, run us through the drill, which does entail students 'lying low' for up to 30 minutes as per lockdown procedures. Parents, you will receive notification via text/email notifying you that it is taking place. Please be aware that this is a drill and it is really important to practice these drills, especially in light of what happened in Christchurch last March, in which schools were in lockdown for up to 5 hours. LETTER FOR PARENTS Re: LOCK DOWN EXERCISE

Dear Parents

Recently, Te Atatu Intermediate engaged the services of an independent company, Harrison Tew[®], who specialise in emergency management planning for schools. The procedures developed by Harrison Tew allow us to respond safely and quickly to a range of circumstances.

As a component of the implementation of the emergency procedures into our school, specialised training is being conducted with senior leadership and our staff. The students will also receive training directed at their respective age groups from Harrison Tew[®].

The training consists of a low key but detailed approach to potential threats and has been successfully implemented in hundreds of schools throughout New Zealand.

After the training, we will be conducting a lock down exercise under the guidance and support of Harrison Tew[®].

The exercise will be as real-life as possible, which will mean that parents/families will receive notification by way of text and/or email. The information passed on will emphasise that this is an exercise/practice and will explain that all updated information will then be posted on the school website.

Prior to this occurring, can I please remind all parents and caregivers to ensure your contact details (mobile phone numbers and email addresses) are current as this will be our communication with you, should an emergency occur at the school.

In a genuine incident, should you hear of a lock down or evacuation at the school, can I please ask that you do not attend the school or phone, as we will not be able to respond. Your presence at, or contact with, the school may make it more difficult for us to manage the situation and could potentially place your children and, in fact, yourselves at risk.

WAITAKERE TEACHER AIDE/LEARNING SUPPORT PROGRAMME 26 WEEKS FIXED TERM EMPLOYMENT

20 HOURS PER WEEK

Waitakere Improving School Attendance Programme is continuing our "Return to the Workforce" programme for parents who currently receive the Sole Parent Support benefit. We are able to employ 12 Teacher Aides/Learning Support to work in one of the following schools: **Flanshaw Road School; Glen Eden Intermediate; Glen Eden Primary; Henderson Intermediate; Liston College; Rangeview Intermediate; Te Atatu Intermediate; Tirimoana Primary; and Waitakere College.** The work is during normal school hours.

The positions are for a 26 week fixed term period commencing Monday 16th March 2020. The project is partially funded by Work and Income through the Ministry of Development Flexi-Wage Project in the Community. The rate of pay will be \$18.90 per hour (plus holiday pay, Kiwisaver and ACC). There is no guarantee that the teacher aide positions will continue after the end of the project.

Successful applicants will develop teacher aide / learning support skills through working with teachers and students in a classroom, supporting literacy, numeracy and general learning needs; and preparing teaching resources and other duties as requested by the school. A job description and training will be provided by each school.

All successful applicants will be required to complete a satisfactory police vet and to be available for interviews during the week Monday 17th – Friday 21st February.
